

They are currently aiding with the creation of the Asian Heritage Celebration, a joint collaboration with other on-campus Asian student organizations and the Multicultural Center.

Community Champion of Diversity Award Dallas Jewish Community Foundation



We are proud to recognize the Dallas Jewish Community Foundation with this year's Community Champion of Diversity Award. Led by President and CEO Meyer Bodoff and Board Chair Rusty Cooper, the foundation has worked for more than 40 years to improve the Jewish community and the world through the development and stewardship of philanthropic resources. In the past decade, the foundation and its supporting organizations have contributed more than \$125 million to support more than 900 agencies throughout our community, funding programs and initiatives focused on a wide range of philanthropic interests, including education, human services, the arts and faith-based organizations.

The Dallas Jewish Community Foundation has served as an ally to the University's Ackerman Center for Holocaust Studies. Working closely with the center, the foundation has been a catalyst for providing diverse programming at the Ackerman Center, which in the past year included a Jewish Refugees in Shanghai exhibition and a Labyrinth of Lies film screening. To date, the foundation has funded more than 25 UT Dallas students.

Additionally, in light of the recent increased prevalence of anti-Semitism both nationally and locally, Mr. Bodoff authored an editorial titled "Cowards," acknowledging the alarming trends and calling for action and solidarity.

Corporate Diversity Award Deloitte



Each year, the Office of Diversity and Community Engagement recognizes a corporation or business that has positively impacted diversity and inclusion at the University. This year's Corporate Diversity Award recipient is Deloitte – a valued corporate partner with engagement across the University. Each spring for the last three years, diversity and inclusion thought leaders from Deloitte have presented their research findings as part of the Office of Diversity and Community Engagement's Diversity Lecture Series. The lectures have covered a range of topics including the impact of millennials on the multi-generational workplace and the importance of creating a business environment for employees to be their authentic selves. Deloitte's partnership with the Diversity Lecture Series has played a significant role in fostering a welcoming and inclusive University.

Deloitte's contributions to UT Dallas extend well beyond the Office of Diversity and Community Engagement. Business leaders from Deloitte have been active on the Naveen Jindal School of Management Dean's Advisory Council. Deloitte is also one of the Jindal School's top 10 employers and has employed a large number of the school's alumni. Deloitte professionals frequently recruit students for public accounting positions from the campus' National Association of Black Accountants and the Association of Latino Professionals for America. They have also partnered with the Jindal School Career Management Center to host mock interviews, information sessions and recruitment initiatives with the Davidson Management Honors Program and the Women in Technology student organization.

Staff Diversity Award Jazmyne Brown



Jazmyne Brown is an Enrollment Services Advisor II in the UT Dallas Office of Admission and Enrollment. She joined the office in January 2016. Jazmyne works with prospective students and parents to learn more about opportunities available to them at the University. She conducts recruiting and outreach visits to students in Dallas and areas south to Waco. Jazmyne has become extremely involved in her territory schools and within the UT Dallas community, continually devising initiatives to create engagement opportunities to connect the two. As a rising leader in our underrepresented minority recruitment efforts, Jazmyne actively coordinates initiatives with other departments throughout campus and is leading the efforts for a large DFW collaboration event in Dallas ISD with the other participating universities. Her efforts have led to a significant increase in the number of Hispanic and African American students from her territory who have been admitted for fall 2017.
